
Title 1 – One of the purposes for Title 1 is to improve academic performance of participants in basic and more advanced skills. Title 1 has several components operating within Cool Valley.




Counselor – The counselor supports academic and social success by counseling students, parents and teachers in ways to optimize the environment for learning.


Social Worker – The social worker supports student's families with resources for successful school and home connections.







ORGANIZATIONS

Parents Advisory Council – Is a volunteer organization designed to unite home, school and community in promoting the education, health and safety of children? This organization meets the second Monday of each month at a scheduled time.

Special Awards

Academic Honor Roll – Any student who receives A's or B's on their Report card for any quarter of the school year.

Citizenship Honor Roll – Any student who follows Character Plus traits consistently are honored each quarter.

Perfect Attendance – Any student attending school every day on time will be recognized each quarter.

Most Improved – Is an incentive program for all students, grades $kg - 5^{th}$. Classroom teachers as well as special area teachers choose the most improved student once a quarter. Proud Principal Award – Students, who turn in money found on the playground, or in school, will have their names announced over the P.A. system at the end of the school day. Money unclaimed by students will be returned to the finder at the end of the quarter.

PARENT EXPECTATIONS

 Students should not arrive at school before 8:20am; there is no supervision before that time. During inclement weather students will sit down outside of their classroom until the bell rings at 8:40am. 2. Classroom Visitation:

Parents or guardians are welcome to schedule classroom visits to be supportive of their student's education. These visits shall be schedule in advance with the teacher and principal prior to the actual visitation. In order not to disrupt the instructional process or violate the privacy of students and for safety and security, these visits will be for observation only, not for parents conferences. All visitors must report to the office to sign in to receive a visitor's badge, this is a safety precaution.

 Kindergartens will be dismissed, at 3:20pm without the bell. Car riders and walkers will be dismissed at 3:20pm: <u>NO</u> <u>STUDENTS ARE RELEASED FROM THE OFFICE AFTER</u> <u>3:00PM.</u> Bus riders will be dismissed by the principal/or-designated official as buses arrive. Students <u>will not</u> be supervised after 4:00pm; students left after 4:00pm will be transported to Vogt and placed in the Y-Club a \$15.00 dollar fee will be assessed at pickup.

- 4. It is required that a parent/guardian call school by 9:30am if Student will be absent for any reason. If no call is received, the school will be calling to verify that they are home safe.
- 5. A note is required from the parent before a child will be allowed to stay in from recess (not to exceed one day.) A doctor's note is necessary for a longer stay inside.
- 6. All medication must be cleared through the nurse's office with a doctor's directions and in a prescription bottle. Students are never allowed to take medicine on their own.

CAFETERIA SERVICE

Cafeteria services are provided during breakfast and lunch. All breakfasts and lunches served meet the requirement of the U.S. Department of Agriculture and included a choice of drink. Breakfast and lunch is free for all of our families for this 2016-2017 school year. Please don't send soda/carbonated drinks in cans or bottles as part of your child's lunch.
