

Mini-Lessons - provide a short focused lesson on a strategy or concept that allows teachers to model, explicitly teach, then have guided and independent practice. Mini-lessons allow for students to learn in small chunks and can be implemented in all content areas. Guided Math - after presenting a math mini-lesson, teachers will assess the students using a quick check protocol. Teachers will intervene with students demonstrating misunderstandings before moving to another skill or concept. Standards Based Planning - Teachers will plan based on the standard not the resource. Teachers will follow the curriculum pacing guide but will ensure that unit activities and assessments are aligned to a standard.
