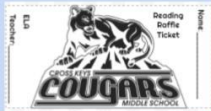

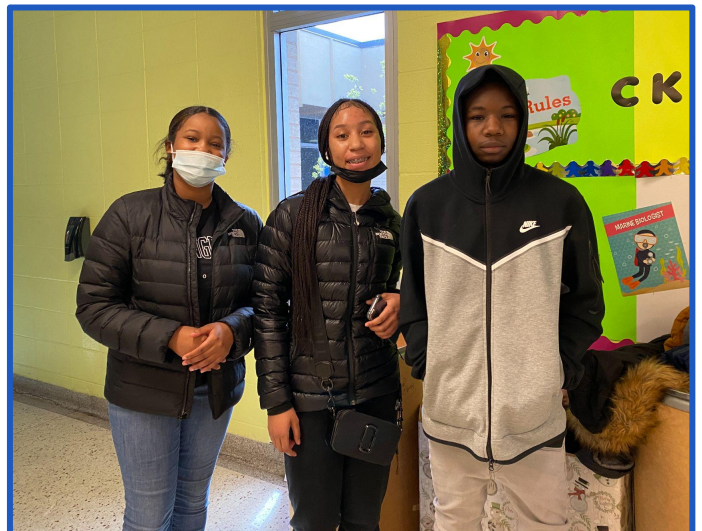

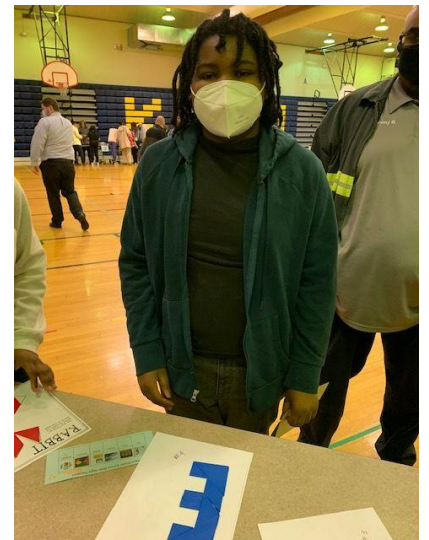

 - No OSS for the month of April
- Cost to Student
 - If you have a Season Pass
 - \$10 for bus
 - If you do not have a Season Pass
 - \$40 for ticket and bus
 - Tickets are nonrefundable
- Sack lunches to those who request, otherwise money for food or own lunch must be sent
- Students must ride the bus to and from Six Flags
- Parent Chaperones are permitted, dependent upon spacing and availability
